It is the #1 permanently disabling birth defect in the U.S.A.

It is known as a "Neural Tube" defect

It occurs during the first month of pregnancy when the spinal cord fails to come together properly

It can cause varying degrees of nerve damage leading to partial paralysis and bowel and bladder complications

There are approximately 70,000 individuals with Spina Bifida living in the United States

7 in every 10,000 births in the United States has Spina Bifida

60 million women are at risk of having a child with Spina Bifida

Taking Folic Acid supplements during child bearing years can reduce the incidence of this birth defect by 70%
